Principals' Comments:	<ul> <li>T. Schulte reported:</li> <li>He said it has been quiet for the past week and a half on the technology side of things.</li> <li>The Technology Committee met yesterday. They discussed establishing avenues for professional development with teachers because everyone is at different stages of learning. He talked about a possible Tech Camp to be held on one of the Superintendent Conference Days. They also discussed procedures and protocols and the different apps out there that faculty/students could take advantage of.</li> </ul>

Bradley reported:</li> <li>He said he was looking forward to the Character Ed assembly where he will be riding in on his bike and talking with the students about his journey from school, to work/athlete.</li> <li>He reported that Mr. Parnapy applied for a scholarship through the New York Agriculture Outreach Program and was given \$5,000. He wants to use it for incubators, chicken coops, multi-meters, etc.</li> <li>He said he and P. McGee are working through their second round of observations of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year teachers and it is going great.</li> <li>They have revamped the mentor program and made adjustments to the procedures and processes.
