## BusinessL. Prinz just let the Board know that the Budget Newsletter was sent offAdministratorto the printers and it should be to the school by Wednesday/Thursday.Comments:There are five public hearings scheduled to present the 2018-2019Budget thoughout the area.

Reports: GVEP Presentation – Kevin MacDonald and Ernie Haywood came on behalf of GVEP. Ernie talked about the high number of students from Byron-Bergen that go to BOCES, we are among the highest of the schools that participate. He said that he loves how well represented Byron-Bergen's Administrative Team is at the events that are put on by BOCES because not a lot of other schools have great representation. He provided a list of awards that were given out for students who attended BOCES in the 2016-2017 school year. Kevin MacDonald talked about the proposed administrative budget for the 2018-2019 year and the election of the four candidates to the GVEP Board that our Board would be voting on later in the meeting. He said that over all the administrative budget has decreased due to some debt dropping off and refinancing some loans and termination of a lease from another school. They thanked everyone for all the support they give to GVEP.

Transportation Update – Drew Doll gave the transportation update. He said that every three years the 19-A records are reviewed and received a 100%. There were no convictions reported but there were three accidents (two of which were car/deer involving personal vehicles and one was with a bus). The total miles driven from 2016 to 2017 have decreased. He and L. Prinz will be attending a law course at BOCES on transportation issues. He talked about the two new proposed buses that are being listed on the ballot and the sale of three buses that are no longer needed. He also talked about the major issue of motorists passing school buses when the stop sign is out and getting passed on the right side when students are exiting the bus.

Academic Focus:
 C. Schroth showed everyone the IBL lab that the Elementary students use. He talked about the grant money the school received to improve the lab and all the new products he was able to purchase. He said this is his third year doing the IBL lab and the students have so much fun learning. He talked about the new 3D printers, CAD programs, Lego Robotics, etc. He talked about the Engineer Design Process – Ask, Imagine, Plan, Create, Improve, and Communicate. He said that there is a lot of collaboration and working in groups so the students can talk things out and see how they work. He made mention that there have been about four schools who have come to us to see how our program is implemented because we are the leader of STEM in this area.

Superintendent's Comments:	M. Edwards said that last Wednesday he and Roger met with the Bergen Town Supervisor and the Mayor of the Village of Bergen to discuss the matters happening in the Town and Village of Bergen. They talked about the schools and their budgets, issues of cost of doing business, and how it is on the rise. They talked about our Capital Project, their Water Project, the 7 <sup>th</sup> /8 <sup>th</sup> grade Clean Up Day, and improvements to Robbins Brook Park. They had a Capital Project meeting last Friday and there were some unexpected cost increases and they will have to make some reductions; they are still waiting for the designs to come in but hopefully will be able to go to bid in July. He said Drew held the Health/Safety meeting and it went very well; they talked about building safety, the emergency flip charts, table top drills, and what is being done in each building for safety measures.
