There are five areas of focus that include: keyboarding skills, reading online print, interacting with online print (highlighting, notes, etc.), drafting directly on a computer, and interacting with online math tools. Genesee Community College sent out their annual update for our students who participate in the ACE (Accelerated College Enrollment) programs. This year Byron-Bergen offered 13 programs and

we had 75 students participate. These students earned a total of 424 college credit hours and significant tuition savings. Byron-Bergen was also awarded with the 2017 School Safety Excellence Award given by Utica National Insurance Group. This award is in recognition of the school districts' efforts to create a safer school environment, and as a direct result of the districts' diligence and adherence to safety principles prescribed to safety group members.
