President's Report: D. List said that Mickey, Yvonne, and herself attended the Voice of the

Membership meeting with the BBFA and it went very well. She spoke about the GVSBA BOE Professional Development session on October 22nd. She stated that the tour of the Elementary and Natatorium were

acceptable.

Principals'

P. McGee reported:

- He said that the Community Action Day in Bergen was Tuesday for the 7th graders and it was a very productive day.

- The senior class is not doing an overnight trip this year and will do two day trips instead.

- On Friday, Channel 10 will be interviewing the school on their 100% graduation rate. He wanted to thank Gretchen for her amazing work on getting all the information on the school out to the public.

B. Brown reported:

- She thanked the Board for all that they do and presented them with "bee" mugs (made by the kindergarten class). Ken Rogoyski on behalf of the BBFA presented thank you cards to the Board in honor of School Board Appreciation Week.
- She talked about the September Character Ed Assembly, the play, and new B-B chant. She said it went very well. The next Character Ed Assembly is next week and will be about respect and is acknowledging the Bus Drivers for Bus Driver Appreciation Week.
- They had Fire Prevention Day on October 11th and they tried something different this year by doing a station rotation and it went very well.

- Red Ribbon Week starts Tuesday, October 23rd and on Friday, October 26th S.A.D.D will be hosting a roller skating family night for Pre-K 6.
- The Turkey Trot is scheduled for Thursday, November 8th.

Business Administrator Comments: L. Prinz stated that the last day for school tax collection is October 30th. She said there have been a few duplicate payments that will have to be refunded at the end of collection. She said there is a correction to the pesticide treatment that is up for approval, it is to help kill the flowers which should help with the bees. She said that Nick Brinkman will have completed his 26-week probation and is asking to appoint him to a permanent position. She also is asking the Board to approve the Corrective Action Plan in response to the audit that was performed by Lumsden & McCormick.

Reports:

Rich Hannan came in to talk about how the athletic scheduling works for the different seasons. He said that each sport has a coordinator that help build the league schedules (dates, times, who). The coaches can then choose to participate in 2-6 non-league games. Some of the sports will not play us out of class because they could be penalized if they were to lose, but for volleyball there is no penalty for playing out of class. There is a 75-mile cap to travel for sectional games during the school week only. They schedule two seasons ahead. The fall schedule is generally completed by January.

Scott and Betsy gave their State of Special Education report. They talked about the different trainings that the special education teachers have and will be going through. They just had a training on Educational Benefits; scheduled for the future are trainings for using transition assessments, present levels of performance, measurable annual goals, progress monitoring, and accommodations. There are also trainings for administration and meetings with Linda Johnson. CSE meetings have been held and initial meetings for new referrals are in the works. Changes to the IEP writing process are in the works. Monthly meetings are being held with special education teams to help with all the changes that have come up.

Academic Focus:

Betsy talked about "The Learning Challenge" that Diana Walther and Debbie Slocum brought back from their Instructional Coaching conferences. The challenge was called Opinion Corners and it was done at the October 2nd Elementary Faculty meeting. The teachers were provided a controversial statement (or question) and the teachers had to pick one of the four corners (strongly agree, agree, strongly disagree, or disagree). They were allowed to defend their opinions and if you wanted to, you could change corners. Some of the teachers have already brought this into their classrooms. It helps promote listening skills, verbal

communication, critical thinking, and decision-making. She also talked about how Mike Fisher came out to help support our ELA curriculum work.
