She said that all the winter sports teams are doing well and wishes them the best of luck finishing up the season. Principals' S. Bradley reported: Comments: -Elizabeth Piper won the Poetry Out Loud contest. Jeff Parnapy received all of the equipment he ordered with the grant money he received. They are working on consultant/teacher training for the 9th grade. -A meeting will be held in February to discuss processes and ideas for the Jr./Sr. High Special Education Team and how to move forward. There are 54 faculty and staff members enrolled in a 10-day health and wellness program. B. Meister reported: Before break there was a lot going on in the Elementary. They had band and chorus concerts that went very well. They did two different sing-a-longs split among the different grade levels. He gave a "huge thanks" to Betsy and the Safety Team for a great LEAD (Law Enforcement Appreciation Day). The Genesee County Sheriff's Department had several law enforcement representatives come in on January 9th to talk to the students about law enforcement.

Business Administrator Comments:	L. Prinz stated that the two new drivers that were hired to replace the two who left in December are doing well on their new routes. January is a busy month for the Transportation Department with a lot of retesting being done per State requirements. The Transportation Coordinator position is now posted. She and Mickey have started talking with administrators about budget plans and they met with Drew first to discuss transportation needs. He expressed his needs for two buses and one van to be up for vote. Also, there are two lifts in the bus garage and one needs to be replaced so they are looking into what can be done. They discussed the rates of sub drivers increasing to be in line with other schools in the area. The SEQRA that she is asking the Board to approve is the 2018-2019 Capital Outlay that would focus on the High School office and the District Office.

Meister reported that UPK grant funding for the 2018- 2019 school year has remained the same as last year and we are required to give the Gillam Grant (our collaborative partner) 10% of the funding. The NYSED grant paperwork is done annually and this year it required a lot more detailed answers, not the standard box checking. For the 2018-2019 school year they have two half-day sessions with a total of 36 students. The UPK Program has students working on stations and kinesthetics. Technology Report – T. Schulte reported that the last few months have been very busy in the "technology realm." They have been working with BOCES and EduTech to get the last round of Chromebooks in and ready for student use. They are working on getting the projection systems in. The Smartboard replacement in the Jr./Sr. High classrooms will be underway soon. Still waiting on the State for the Smart Bond application that was turned in so the school can move forward on its security system
