# BYRON-BERGEN CENTRAL SCHOOL BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 5:58 p.m. by President D. List.

President's Report: D. List just thanked Yvonne for running the meeting on 1/19/17 while she

was on vacation. Debi reminded everyone that the Legislative Breakfast is taking place on Saturday, February 4, 2017 at Geneseo Central High

School at 8:45 a.m.

Safety Audit Report: Office Butler conducted a Safety Audit for the school in November 2016 with a survey sent out to all staff, faculty, and students (grades 7-12). The survey contained questions such as personal perceptions of safety, drug use and weapons possession within the schools, crimes committed within the schools, and racial/ethnic and harassment within the schools.

Once the data was compiled, he conducted a two-day audit that consisted of teachers, parents, administrators, and emergency service personnel. He reported on the strengths and weakness of both the Jr./Sr.

High School and the Elementary School and made recommendations where both schools could improve on some minor things, however

neither of the schools are in any danger.

T. Schulte reported:

- The Technology Committee met last week and are working on their draft which and will be presented soon.

### B. Meister reported:

- He talked about the faculty focusing on instructional time with the students and getting down to the core materials with it being winter and there is not a lot of time for extra things like going outside.
- The movie night that took place on January 20<sup>th</sup> went very smoothly and there were a great number of people who attended even with the huge basketball game that was going on.
- He said the kids are excited for the February break coming up.

### P. McGee reported:

- He commended Officer Butler for his hard work and dedication he put into the Safety Audit and recommendations to make our schools even safer.
- The Jr./Sr. High was recognized by the AP Honor Roll for their performance and participation. They are also trying to offer more AP classes for students.
- The Jr./Sr. High was awarded a \$1,000.00 grant to be used towards soft skills events.
- Mid-term week is being evaluated and the focus is on maximizing instructional time in the classroom.

Academic Focus:

Samantha Golden gave a presentation for the Liberty Partnerships Program (LPP). LPP services over 350 students throughout the state. LPP was established in 1989 to address the dropout rates of students and to rebuild tomorrow's workforce. They are funded by New York State Department of Education and are based out of Genesee Community College for this region. There is no cost to the district or students who participate. It is a 12-month wrap-around program to keep the students engaged with learning so there is not a loss of focus during the summer months. Byron-Bergen currently has 40 students who participate in the program. Either a teacher or a counselor can send a referral for a student to enroll in this program; they will take a resiliency assessment to see where they fall on the spectrum. After the assessment is completed each child has a personal learning plan designed for them. The program received another 5-year grant that will run from September 2017 through August 2022. Samantha is a school counselor and mental health

counselor. She provides help with homework, a quiet lunch area, after school program, college tours, snacks, lounge area, etc. for the students. In the summer students participate in a 4-week Career Summer Institute (CSI) where they learn about culinary and animal science at BOCES. LPP is a great program for our school.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special meeting of the qualified voters of the Byron-Bergen Central School District shall be held at the Byron-Bergen Jr./Sr. High School Fitness/Exercise Room in said District, on Friday, March 31, 2017, between the hours of 6:00

A.M. and 9:00 P.M. The following propositions will be submitted for voter approval at said meeting:

#### PROPOSITION #1

Shall the following resolution be adopted to wit:

RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BYRON-BERGEN CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO UNDERTAKE CERTAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS CONSISTING OF ADDITION TO, AND CONSTRUCTION AND RECONSTRUCTION OF, EXISTING SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES, VARIOUS SITE IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF CERTAIN ORIGINAL FURNISHINGS, EQUIPMENT, AND APPARATUS AND OTHER INCIDENTAL IMPROVEMENTS REQUIRED IN CONNECTION THEREWITH FOR SUCH CONSTRUCTION AND SCHOOL USE, ALL AT AN ESTIMATED MAXIMUM AGGREGATE COST OF \$20,452,902; AND TO APPROPRIATE AND EXPEND FROM THE EXISTING CAPITAL RESERVE FUND \$2,000,000 FOR SUCH COSTS, AND THAT THE BALANCE OF SUCH COST, OR SO MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY, SHALL BE RAISED BY THE LEVY OF A TAX TO BE COLLECTED IN ANNUAL INSTALLMENTS, WITH SUCH TAX TO BE PARTIALLY OFFSET BY STATE AID AVAILABLE THEREFOR; AND, IN ANTICIPATION OF SUCH TAX, DEBT OBLIGATIONS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AS MAY BE NECESSARY NOT TO EXCEED \$18,452,902 SHALL BE ISSUED.

#### PROPOSITION #2

Shall the following resolution be adopted to wit:

RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BYRON-BERGEN CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO REQUEST ADDITIONAL STATE AID FOR ENERGY SAVINGS CONTRACT IMPROVEMENTS UNDER AN ENERGY PERFORMANCE CONTRACT PREVIOUSLY AUTHORIZED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION, AT AN ESTIMATED MAXIMUM AGGREGATE COST OF \$2,346,892; WHICH ENERGY SAVINGS CONTRACT REQUIRES ADDITIONAL VOTER APPROVAL TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR ADDITIONAL ENHANCED STATE BUILDING AID.

NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that the text of the aforesaid propositions may appear on the ballot labels in the following abbreviated form:

#### PROPOSITION #1

Shall the proposition set forth in the legal notice of this special voter meeting, authorizing the addition to, and construction, reconstruction and equipping of, existing school buildings and facilities, including various site and other incidental improvements, all at an estimated maximum aggregate cost of \$20,452,902; with the expenditure of \$2,000,000 from the existing capital reserve fund for such costs, the issuance of not to exceed \$18,452,902 of debt obligations of the School District therefor, the levy of a tax in annual installments therefor, all as more fully described in said notice, be approved?

#### PROPOSITION #2

Shall the proposition set forth in the legal notice of this special voter meeting, authorizing the Board of Education to request additional enhanced State building aid for energy savings contract improvements under an energy performance contract previously authorized by the Board of Education, at an estimated maximum aggregate cost of \$2,346,892, be approved?

The School District, acting as lead agency to the extent necessary for this purpose under the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the applicable regulations promulgated thereunder ("SEQRA"), has completed its environmental review and, on January 19, 2017, has duly determined and found the purpose to be a type II action which will not have a significant impact on the environment and is not subject to any further environmental review under SEQRA.

AND NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN that applications for absentee ballots to vote on the propositions may be applied for at the office of the School District Clerk. Any such application must be received by the District Clerk at least seven days before the date of the aforesaid special district meeting if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before such special district meeting if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. A list of all persons to whom absentee ballots shall have been issued shall be available for public inspection in the office of the District Clerk during regular office hours on each of the five days prior to the day of the vote (excluding Saturday and Sunday). An absentee ballot must reach the office of the District Clerk not later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of such special district meeting.
