WHEREAS, the preliminary SSIP was posted on the District's website for at least 30 days, and the District included an address to which any written comments on the preliminary SSIP should be sent; and WHEREAS, the Board of Education conducted a public hearing, that enabled stakeholders to respond to the preliminary SSIP, for which

adequate notice of the public hearing was provided through local media and the District website for at least two weeks prior to the hearing; and **WHEREAS**, components of the plan have been completed using local funds since that time; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Education has considered all public comments, completed a final SSIP, and determined that approval of the Revised Final SSIP is in the best interest of the District.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Phase 2 Smart Schools Investment Plan for School Connectivity and High Tech Security Projects totaling \$351,950 be approved.
