T. Schulte reported:

establish the core beliefs of what technology can do for everyone.

B. Meister reported:

- Last Friday the 5th/6th grade had their Family Game Night. It was a huge hit with a lot of participation from the community. They raised a lot of money to put towards the trip.
- This week in the Elementary building is health and wellness week and each day of dress up is related to health and wellness. They will conclude the week with a day of Zumba.
- Friday at 9:30 a.m. they will be having another Character Ed.

 Assembly with a special skit for Becky Kelly who is retiring that day.
- The students and staff are looking forward to the Spring Break week coming up where they can take time to relax and regroup to push through for the rest of the school year.

P. McGee reported:

- He and Scott attended the Life Skills dinner before the Board meeting.
 They, along with the students' families, enjoyed a nice meal that was prepared and served by the students.
- He shared an e-mail from Thaddeus Nauden, of the Red Cross.

 Thaddeus could not thank the school enough for all their help with the blood drive. They collected 56 units of blood which is equivalent to saving 168 lives.
- The Mock Trial team placed 2nd in their final competition at the Albion Courthouse. They lost to Pembroke. He would like to see about starting Mock Trial in the 7th and 8th grades because there was a great interest amongst the students.
- He attended the 2017 Youth Recognition Banquet where our school was highly represented. We had three students, one faculty, and an alumni recognized.
- Mr. Kaercher held another College Readiness Night for students and families and they had another great turn out.
- They had 28 Scholar Athletes for the Winter Sports who maintained over a 90% GPA.

Business Administrator Comments: L. Prinz commented on the visit to Civil Service with R. White. It was a very informative meeting and we learned some things that we need to work on and change going forward. In the hiring process, we will make sure the applicant is approved by Civil Service before being approved by the Board. She also said that the New York State budget for 2017-2018 has not been approved. Currently, the State has passed a two month extension which could possibly affect us as a school.

Academic Focus:

Diana Walther presented on her work with video coaching in the Jr. /Sr. High faculty. Video coaching is only available to tenured teachers. They have 30 teachers participating out 56. Of the 30 teachers, 14 have completed the cycle, 11 are reflecting or recording, and 5 are still to

come through the cycle. She has seen a great improvement and willingness to want to learn to teach more effectively and efficiently.

He also received a certificate of recognition from NYSSBA for the November 2016 story "Be the Change for Kids 2016 Winner," that he gave to B. Meister to display in the Elementary School. He also talked about the computer based field testing within our school for ELA and Mathematics because by 2020 all tests in those subjects for grades $3^{rd} - 8^{th}$ will be computer based. He wants to make sure all students will have the necessary skills to succeed for these assessments. He said that the meeting that was scheduled on April 6^{th} at BOCES was cancelled.
