Business Administrator Comments:	L. Prinz said that the Governor was able to finalize the budget on time and our initial proposed budget had gone up. She presented the proposed 2019-2020 school year budget with the numbers that came in from the Governor and there will not have to be any cuts next year. She also talked about the other propositions that will be on the ballot. The Board had some questions and concerns about the other propositions. They discussed that it would be best to go out for a \$2 million Capital Reserve and not \$3 million.

	RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BYRON- BERGEN CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, GENESEE, MONROE AND ORLEANS COUNTIES, NEW YORK AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF TWO PROPOSITIONS TO BE VOTED UPON BY THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF SAID DISTRICT AT THE ANNUAL MEETING THEREOF TO BE HELD ON MAY 21, 2019

BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BYRON-BERGEN CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, GENESEE, MONROE AND ORLEANS COUNTIES, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. At the annual meeting of the qualified voters of the Byron-Bergen Central School District, Genesee, Monroe and Orleans Counties, State of New York, to be held on May 21, 2019 the following propositions shall be submitted to be voted upon (in addition to the proposition approving the budget for the District's 2019-2020 fiscal year):

PROPOSITION NO. 3 – CAPITAL RESERVE-2019

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Byron-Bergen Central School District (the "District") is hereby authorized and directed to establish a reserve fund pursuant to Education Law Section 3651 to be known as the "Capital Reserve-2019," for the purpose of financing, in whole or in part, additions, alterations, renovations or other improvements to existing District's buildings and facilities, the construction of new buildings or facilities or the acquisition of lands or interests in lands for District purposes, including the acquisition and installation of machinery, equipment, apparatus or furnishings required for the purposes of such buildings and facilities, and playgrounds, athletic fields, recreation areas, parking areas, roadways, sidewalks and other site improvements connected to such buildings and facilities, with the ultimate amount of such reserve fund not exceeding Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) plus any accrued earnings on amounts deposited in such reserve fund, the probable existence of said reserve fund being ten (10) years, but said reserve fund to continue in existence for its stated purpose until liquidated in accordance with Education Law, and the source from which funds shall be obtained for said reserve fund being (i) current and future unappropriated fund balances from the General Fund of the District, as directed by the Board of Education, and (ii) any other appropriations authorized by the voters from time to time, and (iii) the transfer to said capital reserve fund of the entire balance, in the amount of approximately \$52,093.05, plus interest earnings on deposit in said District's existing New Millennium Capital Reserve fund established in accordance with Education Law Section 3651 pursuant to a proposition approved by the qualified voters of said District on March 13, 2007.

PROPOSITION NO. 4 – SCHOOL VEHICLE RESERVE-2019

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Byron-Bergen Central School District (the "District") is hereby authorized and directed to establish a capital reserve fund pursuant to Education Law Section 3651, to be known as the "School Vehicle Reserve-2019," for the purpose of financing, in whole or in part, the purchase of school buses and vehicles by the District, with the ultimate amount of such reserve fund not exceeding Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) plus any accrued earnings on amounts deposited in such reserve fund, the probable existence of said reserve fund being ten (10) years, but with such reserve fund continuing in existence for its stated purpose until liquidated in accordance with the Education Law, and the sources from which funds shall be obtained for said reserve fund being (i) current and future unappropriated fund balances from the General Fund of the District, as directed by the Board of Education, and (ii) any other appropriations authorized by the voters from time to time.

Section 2. The District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to include within the notice of said annual meeting required to be to be published and posted by the District, a statement to the affect that the propositions set for the in Section 1 of the resolution will be voted upon at such annual meeting, which notice shall contain the full text of each such proposition.
