Return to Public Session:	It was moved by W. Forsyth and seconded by A. Phillips to return to public session at 6:49 p.m. The motion passed 7 Yes, 0 No.
President's Report:	D. List said that she is pleased to see the weather cooperating a bit so that the Spring teams can get outside and start playing. She said she attended the girls softball game where they raised money for the Wounded Warrior Project and it was a great turnout. She also said that there are a few more budget presentations and the dates and times are on the website.

McGee reported:</li> <li>He thanked Roger and his crew for getting the fields up and running so the spring sports could get underway.</li> <li>He thanked Scott for all his hard work with the State ELA and Math testing that went on. The number of refusals had decreased from last year.</li> <li>He thanked everyone who came out to see the Buzzin' Bistro.
