B. Meister reported:

- The registration numbers for kindergarten are climbing.

 The math assessments were last week and they were about a month apart from the ELA testing. This seemed to have a negative effect for the students who took the tests. They had 46 out of 269 students opt out of the ELA tests and 47 out of 269 opt out of the math tests. They

were not the same students for both of the tests.

P. McGee reported:

- The Buzzin' Bistro Jazz Night and Art show last Friday went very well
