• Energy: Light It Up

• Life Cycles and Traits: Circle of Life

The three students showed the Board an experiment where they measured out 50 mL of water into a Ziploc bag and put in a crushed up Alka-Seltzer tablet. The bag was then sealed and the students had to make observations of what was happening in the bag and how long it

took for the tablet to dissolve.

Director of Instructional Services Comments:

B. Brown said that the Special Education Department is working on simplifying IEPs for students because they are too complex. So far there have been several application received from seniors to get the NYS Seal of Civic Readiness. The Jr./Sr. High is currently focusing on working on curriculum for art, music, and technology.

Director of Technology & Assessment Comments:

J. Back said that Chris Harris from GV BOCES has come out and presented in faculty meetings about AI (Artificial Intelligence) and what it means for our district and students. A survey was sent out to faculty members after the meeting to gather feedback on AI.

Business Administrator Comments:

L. Prinz reported that the school tax collection period is over and the final tax collection report is up for Board approval. The collection rate for this year was 96.64%. The Budget Calendar was handed out to the Board and key dates were discussed. Bids were received for the COEP and the winning company is up for approval under New Business. Lumsden McCormick LLP won the five year RFP for auditing services. Meetings with supervisors and principals to discuss next year's budget has started.
