Senior High Math League places first at first competition of the season



Byron-Bergen Students Awarded with Academic Honors from College Board National Recognition Programs

Three Byron-Bergen students have earned academic honors from the College Board National Recognition Programs. These National Recognition Programs connect underrepresented students who excelled in College Board assessments and schoolwork with universities across the country, helping them meaningfully connect to colleges and stand out during the admissions process.

Ava Wagoner was awarded the National African American Recognition Award. "I'm really excited about the award because with AP (Advanced Placement classes) you have to work hard," said Wagoner, who plans to study engineering after graduation. "It feels good to get the recognition."

"I'm really proud," said Zoey Shepard who was awarded the National Rural and Small Town Award. She plans to study chemical engineering after graduation.

Dayanara Caballero was awarded the National Hispanic Recognition Award, National Rural and Small Town Award, and the National Indigenous Award. "Receiving these awards was really exciting for me," said Caballero. "I'm looking to apply to college to study mathematics or government."

To qualify for recognition, students have a GPA of 3.5 or higher and have excelled on the PSAT/NMSQT or PSAT 10, or earned a score of 3 or higher on two or more AP Exams; and are African American or Black, Hispanic American or Latinx, Indigenous, and/or attend school in a rural area or small town.

"Congratulations to these students," said Byron-Bergen Jr./Sr. High School Principal Ashley John Grillo. "They are dedicated to their studies and push themselves to be the best they can be. They should be very proud of this recognition."














Social & Emotional Learning Update

This year Byron-Bergen Central School District made a goal to develop a toolkit that includes programs, strategies, and resources that will be implemented schoolwide and in classrooms.

Aligning their work closely with the CASEL Five Competencies, faculty began focusing on one of the CASEL's Signature Practices.

"The SEL 3 Signature Practices are one tool for fostering a supportive environment and promote SEL. They intentionally and explicitly help build a habit of practices through which students and adults enhance their SEL skills." (www.casel.org)

Teachers at the elementary level focused on incorporating/continuing to build upon their morning and afternoon meeting times in their daily practices.

Morning Meeting is an engaging way to start each day, build a strong sense of community, and set children up for success socially and academically. Each morning, students and teachers gather together in a circle and interact with one another during four purposeful components:

Greeting: Students and teachers greet one another by name.

Sharing: Students share information about important events in their lives. Listeners often offer empathetic comments or ask clarifying questions.

Group Activity: Everyone participates in a brief, lively activity that fosters group cohesion and helps students practice social and academic skills (for example, reciting a poem, dancing, singing, or playing a game).










Morning Message: Students read and interact with a short message written by their teacher. The message is crafted to help students focus on the work they'll do in school that day. (www.responsiveclassroom.org)

BENEFITS OF SEL

At the Jr./Sr. High, members from the SEL Team shared established strategies and routines that they have been using in their classrooms and see as beneficial to students. Teachers highlighted strategies that included ways to either begin or end class with a focus on checking in with students both emotionally and academically. Some ideas that were highlighted were 'Appreciate, Apologize, Aha', "Rose, Bud, Thorn', as well as daily practices through the use of Google Slides and Forms.

Pesticide Notice

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation enacted a program that requires all schools to provide you with information about pesticide product applications made throughout the school year. Under State law, the school is required to maintain a list of parents, guardians, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour advance written notice prior to a pesticide application. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- · Anti-microbial products:
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- · Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-eat pastes, forms, or gels in areas inaccessible to children:
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals.

In the event that an emergency application is necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list. To register your name with the school to be on a 48-hour notification list, send a request to Byron-Bergen Central School District Office, 6917 W Bergen Rd., Bergen, NY 14416. A written request must be submitted annually.




